- RTI is a process of determining appropriate support and interventions to supplement the core curriculum to meet the needs of all learners.
- RTI is a collaborative strategic problem solving intervention process that supports teachers and leads to improved student outcomes.
- RTI is the practice of providing high-quality instruction and interventions matched to student needs.
- RTI uses learning rate over time and level of performance to inform instructional decisions.
- The purpose of RTI is to help general education teachers meet diverse student needs within the general education classroom.

RTI GOALS

- To reduce referrals to special education
- To improve academic achievement
- To improve student behavior
- To improve school-parental communication and relationships
- To improve teacher comfort with strategies
- To increase collaboration in schools

RTI PROCESS

- 1. Identify the concern.
- 2. Share the concern with the RTI chair.
- 3. Collect available information (data).
- 4. Convene a meeting with the RTI team.
- 5. Develop an intervention plan.
- 6. Support the classroom teacher while implementing the interventions.
- 7. Data collection (8-12 weeks).
- 8. Monitor and evaluate the interventions.
- 9. Reconvene the RTI team to determine effectiveness of RTI intervention plan and determine next steps:
- Continue with intervention plan if student is making adequate progress.
- Discontinue intervention if it is no longer needed.
- Develop new intervention plan if previous plan was not effective.
- Refer to the evaluation team is there if a suspicion of a disability.
