
# \*Label ALL water bottles and individual supplies

# PARENT INSTRUCTIONS

HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD WITH HEART WORDS...

STEP 1: Select the heart word you would like your child to learn. Heart words are highfrequency words that are phonetically irregular. High-frequency words that are regular can be taught along with the phonics pattern it follows.

phonetically irregular highfrequency word due to the "ai" representing the short EXAMPLE: "said" is a e sound.



STEP 2: Show your child the word. Have them repeat it, say the sounds in the word, and

touch a dot or colored card for each sound. Don't worry about the letters yet

STEP 3: Match the **sounds** of the word that are phonetically regular to the letters they correspond with. Write the letters. The letters "ai" in said are not phonetically regular,


therefore the letters do not match the sound.
